

Who can visit Seychelles from 1st August?



- Visitors from permitted countries can visit seychelles from 1st August.
For the list of permitted countries *Visit <http://tourism.gov.sc/covid-19-guidelines/>.*
- Visitors transiting through countries not on the permitted list will be allowed entry only if they do not exit the airport during transit.

Where can I stay in Seychelles



- Visitors must stay in not more than two (2) Safe Tourism Certified establishments or liveaboard for the first seven (7) days. Visit www.tourism.gov.sc for the list and certified businesses.
- Confirmed booking vouchers reflecting the entire duration of stay in Seychelles must be presented upon check-in at the Immigration counter for verification.
- Visitors without a confirmed booking will be directed to another certified establishment.
- Visitors are not permitted to stay in private residences.

On arrival in Seychelles



- Safety measures are in place at the airport for the protection of staff and visitors. Health screening will be conducted on arrival and visitors with symptoms may be asked to undergo a further PCR test.
- Visitors are advised to practice social distancing at all times and if this is not possible they are required to wear face masks.

Moving around in Seychelles



- Island hopping is permitted. For safety, visitors are recommended to arrange all transfers prior to their arrival via Safe Tourism Certified service providers.
- Places of attraction and entertainment will be open with safety protocols in place to ensure the wellbeing of all. The wearing of face masks in public places where social distancing is a challenge is required.
- Visitors must not use public buses.

Extended stay in Seychelles



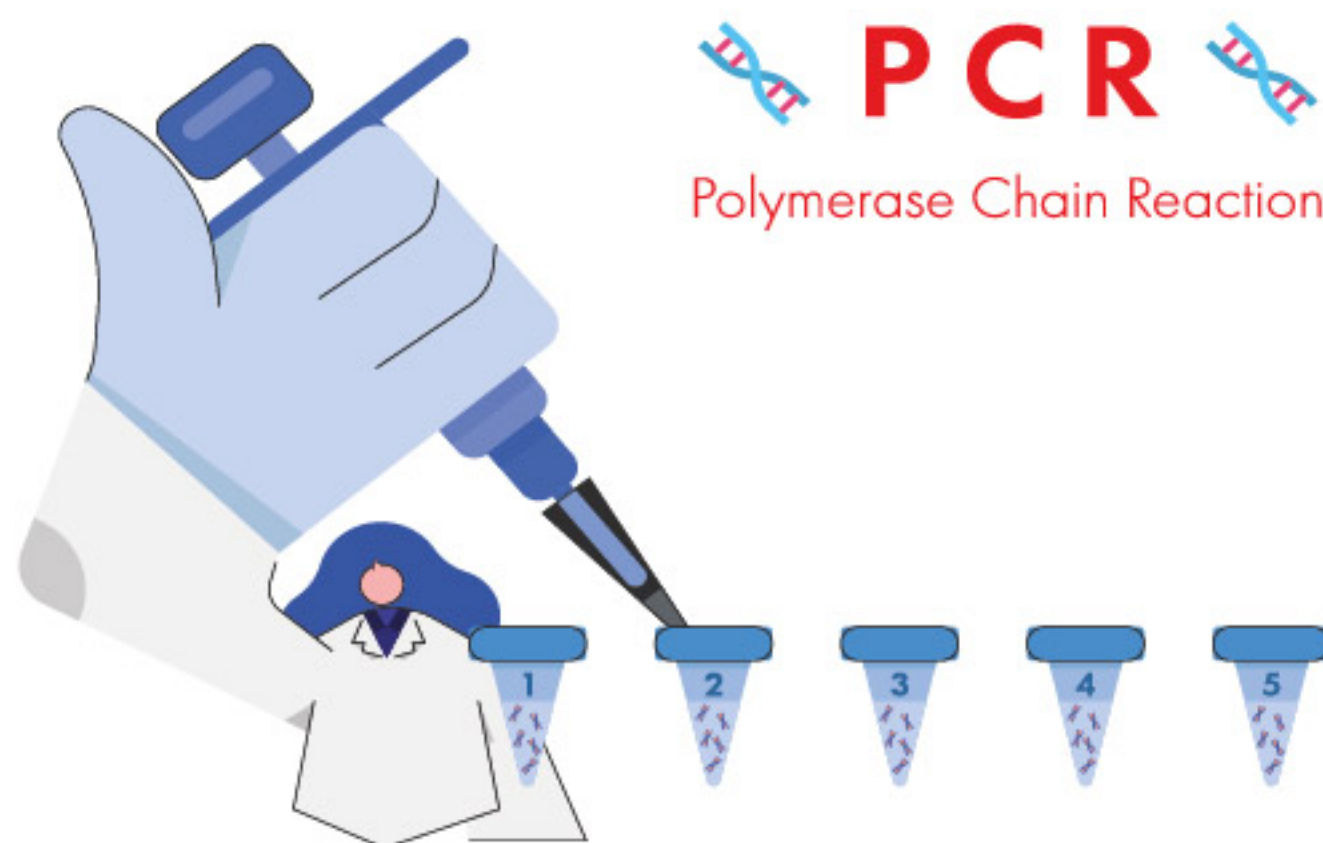
- Visitors staying more than 7 days can enjoy the hospitality of other Safe Tourism Certified accommodation establishments for the remainder of the stay
- In case of a positive PCR results whilst in the destination, quarantine in a designated hotel/facility will be required, depending on the case. Quarantine would normally be up to 14 days if symptoms are detected.

Documents to submit pre-travel



- Visitors must submit negative PCR Test results, flight and accommodation details to visitor@health.gov.sc for verification prior to departure.
- Prescribed form is available from the websites of the Department of Tourism and Department of Health.

PCR Tests in the Seychelles



- PCR Test facilities are available on the three main islands, Mahe (Maison de Football), Praslin (Baie Ste Anne Hospital) and La Digue to visitors prior to departure.
- Visitors needing testing should contact the Public Health Authority in advance on covid19test@health.gov.sc or +248 4388410 to make necessary arrangements.
- PCR test currently costs SCR2500, the same is free for children below 12 and persons above 65 years of age.
